

EVENT DESCRIPTION

Platforms have developed to be the most prominent business model of the digital world. This business model penetrates a variety of different markets.

The Ernst von Caemmerer foundation, the German Hub of the European Law Institute and the Bayreuth Research Center on Consumer Law will jointly shed light on the phenomenon 'platforms' in a comparative and interdisciplinary manner. The conference presentations will be given in English and German.

A comparison of the current state of the European legal discussion on the one side, and the economic perspective on the other shall mark the beginning of the conference. The second part of the conference will focus on dissecting its topic from a comparative legal perspective – with an emphasis on Estonia, France, Italy and the United Kingdom. A panel discussion on the insights gathered from this comparative part of the conference concerning questions as to regulation shall conclude the very same. The third and last part of the conference will foreground both core issues of platforms and their legal realization; in particular, issues regarding the determination of the content of the contract, as well as the responsibility of platform operators or advertising companies and the legal implications of using a feedback system shall be dealt with.

The event is directed towards scholars and students as well as representatives of businesses and administration.
