Intertemporal private law is a well known sub-discipline of (German) Private Law, which takes on a particularly important role when fundamental changes of the law are at stake, and deals with the core issues of legal transition in Private Law.

Brexit brings about such a fundamental change. Brexit, therefore, now poses the question, how English Private Law and the Private Laws of the remaining member states (including EU Private Law) will and should deal with the particular Private Law questions of the fundamental changes in law brougt about by the UK leaving the European Union.
